Well done Darcie, I am looking forward to reading the full script when it is finished.




Policy Change


exists for pupils to learn the vital skills of compromise and collaboration.



Team or group work inside or outside the classroom teaches students the fundamental skills associated with working as a collective unit toward a common goal. This type of teamwork introduces a variety of skills that will be valuable for students later in the workforce, such as communication, compromise and collective effort. In any type of group work, pupils must agree about who will handle various components of a project and work in tandem using one another's strengths to accomplish assigned tasks. This teaches time management, resource

allocation and communication.

After their game, the children then began looking at a book together.









This week we attended a meeting with other mental health leads from Stevenage, to share good practice and find out Hertfordshire about other local organisations that can support children and families struggling with mental health needs. One of the organisations presenting was 'Herts Mind Network', who

shared that they have a designated website for young people and a helpline (01923 256391) for children aged 10-17 years. They also have bite sized training videos on topics such as Emotional Well Being and Coping Strategies and the 5 Ways to Well Being, which are suitable for parents or older children who want to understand strategies to help themselves.

BREAKFAST CLUB
