

Scientist of the Month	Lilly D We have been learning about plants in both Science and English this week. Lilly has shown a great understanding of what plants need to grow well and has used Scientific vocabulary to explain the processes. This is her description of the parts of a plant: <u>Roots</u> Roots anchor the plant and absorb water and nutrients. <u>Stem</u> The stem keeps the plant upright to transport water and food to the rest of the plant. <u>Leaves</u>
	Leaves take in the carbon dioxide and sunlight and use photosynthesis to make food for the plant. <u>Flowers</u> Flowers are brightly coloured so bees can come and take some pollen.

April is Stress Awareness month

Stress is a condition or feeling experienced when a person perceives that: "Demands exceed the



personal and social resources the individual is able to mobilise."

The Stress Management Society uses a bridge analogy to approach the topic of stress. When a bridge is carrying too much weight, it will eventually collapse. It is possible to see the warning signs before this happens, the bridge would bow, buckle and creak.

The same principle can be applied to human beings, with excessive demands and challenges are placed on our bridges. There may be early warning signs. However stress can creep up on some of us, resulting in an unexpected breakdown.

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
