


Geography - International week

about the countries of Nigeria and Japan.




Year 5 has created artwork inspired by Yinka Ilori (a British/Nigerian artist).

Sending a Malicious Communication Section 1 of the Malicious Communications Act 1988 Paragraph 3 of the Malicious Communications (Northern Ireland) Order 1988 A person who sends to another person (from the age of 10)



Either: a letter, electronic communication or article of any description which conveys a message which is indecent or grossly offensive

a threat or information which is false and is known or believed to be false by the sender or any article or electronic communication which is, in part or whole of an indecent or grossly offensive nature with intent that it should cause distress or anxiety to the recipient or any other person to whom the person sending it intends that it or its contents or nature be communicated.
