

As part of our school travel plan we have been thinking about the importance of safer travel. It's that time of the year again and 'Be Bright Be Seen' is an important message for all our pupils and the whole school community. The Active and Safer Travel Team are continuing to promote this as a key part of the road safety and active travel programme, especially over the Autumn and Winter months.

As the days are getting shorter, now is a good time to remind everyone of the importance of wearing bright and reflective clothing when out and about, to make them more visible to traffic. Following an assembly with Mrs Khangura the children completed an activity in class.





Financial education workshops

On Monday and Tuesday, staff from HSBC made a return visit to the school to run further workshops from their financial education outreach programme. This programme was set up following research which showed over half of children aged 7-14 years old did not have a good

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understanding of personal finance terms such as debt, interest or fraud.



Every year group, from Reception through to Year 6 participated in a session which followed the learning framework of 'introduce, discuss and use', allowing for interactive learning and ongoing development of ideas beyond the session itself. Topics discussed included:
