


# The Leys Have Talent

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#### Spiritual, Moral, Social, Cultural and British Values

In Year 3, following on from having Gripping Yarns come to the school to show us some anti-bullying drama, the children have been doing work around bullying and kindness. A really important message that the children took away is never to 'stand by' with bullying and always tell a trusted adult.





Additionally, we took time to go through the protected characteristics and make sure that we are always respectful of each other. The children have also been looking at the impact of bullying and then looking for ways we can be kind instead. In class, we discussed these kindness scenarios and plan to use them in school

and at home.

Year 5

Year 6: Holly and Olive: We enjoyed the Gripping Yarns because it was funny and had a good message. The workshop was about bullying and how you should act if this happens. It was displayed in a fun way.

Last Friday was NSPCC Number Day where classes stepped away from their usual maths lessons to try something a little bit different.

In Year 1, pupils looked at what their favourite number was and made it in lots of different ways. They worked in teams and competed in a relay race to complete a number line to 20, using numbers and words. Pupils also went on a number hunt around the playground completing number lines as they went.





Year 3 children made multiplication flowers. These flower templates are a fantastic way to help pupils with learning multiples of numbers to support times tables. The templates have a number in the centre and the timetables around the outside on each petal.

In Year 6, pupils took part in a maths challenge which involved solving maths puzzles to find pieces of a key. For each correct answer, the teacher revealed a hidden piece of the key. There were ten pieces that made up the key, like a jigsaw.

KNOW how to use tools, apps and settings that can help to keep your child safe online.


