Year 2 worked together to think about what people, places and things can keep them safe.











Year 3 identified different dangers and how we can keep ourselves safe.

At the end of last year, the whole school studied the book "One Christmas Wish" which was about a boy who was lonely on Christmas Eve. In Year 6, we made a link with the issue of homelessness and how lonely an experience it can be. Here is an excerpt from Zack's newspaper report about a fictional teenager who had sadly experienced sleeping rough on the streets:

Natasha (whose name has been changed for safety reasons) is a 14-year-old girl who may be safe now but it was only a month or two ago when she was one of the many prisoners of homelessness. It all started in 2020 when she kept getting in bad arguments with Sophia and John (her parents). In 2022 it was so bad she left home!

We went to Sophia and John who shared how guilty they felt through deafening sobs, "We have been terrible parents and all we want is our little baby back." cried the two heartbroken parents. After that we went to see Natasha who explained how bad it was and she found the best thing she could do was enter abandoned houses and flats. They were dirty and full of animals such as rats, mice and spiders but it was better than sleeping outside. Natasha left home without any plans so she had to adapt quickly. She said it was like having a horrendous nightmare but it was completely real. Natasha didn't even go to school as she was in fear of bullies.

## **Dick Whittington Pantomime**

This week we were very lucky as we had the Hurricane Touring Theatre company come in and perform a show- live!

The performance was based on the classic Dick Whittington;

Dick Whittington goes to London seeking his fortune. He finds adventure, love and a particular nasty King Rat!
