TRANSITION FROM RECEPTION TO YEAR 1

READING




Every week your child will bring home a reading book.

All children need to read at least 5 times a week please date, sign and record any comments in their reading record.

Staff will check and change the books every <u>Tuesday.</u>

READING EXPECTATIONS

By the end of Year 1 children should:

- · apply phonic knowledge and skills to read new words
- read words, noting alternative sounds e.g.. oo in look and oo zoo
 - read words containing familiar sounds
- read and understand word endings including -s, -es, -ing,
 -ed, -er and -est
- read other words of more than one syllable that contain known sounds
 - read I'm, I'll, we'll and understand the use of the apostrophe



When reading with your child

- Encourage them to use their **phonic knowledge** to read new words.
 - Talk to the children about what happens in the book.
- Ask children to predict what might happen in the story.
 - Discuss emotions and feelings.
 - Describe the characters and their motives.
 - Relate book to real life.
 - Look out for new vocabulary.

We will provide a list of other suitable questions in their reading records.

PHONICS

Phonics will be taught in class with support from the Teaching Assistant.

In the summer term, children will take part in a phonic screening check. They will be tested on their ability to read real and nonsense words using their blending skills.



SPELLING EXPECTATIONS

By the end of year 1 children should spell:


- words containing each of the 40+ phonemes already taught
 - common exception words (tricky words)
 - the days of the week
 - · words ending in -s, -es, -ing, -ed, -er and -est

WRITING EXPECTATIONS




By the end of Year 1 children should write sentences by:

- Composing a sentence orally before writing it
- Sequencing sentences to form short narratives
- · Using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops reliably
 - Use question marks and exclamation marks in their writing.
 - Re-reading what they have written to check that it makes sense
 - Discuss what they have written with the teacher or other pupils
 - Read aloud their writing clearly enough to be heard by their peers and the teacher.
 - There will be a school focus on handwriting, children must hold their pencil correctly and form letters in the correct direction.



MATHS EXPECTATIONS



By the end of Year 1 children should:

count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning from any given number

read and write numbers to 100 in numerals;

count in multiples of twos, fives and tens

identify one more and one less than a given number

read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in words.

read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs

represent and use number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20

solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, using practical objects.

Be able to identify the tens and ones in a number.

HOMEWORK



Homework is given out every **Friday** to be returned completed on a **Thursday**.

The children will have two pieces of homework

Maths - an activity relating to their learning that week.

English- spellings relating to the phonics they have learnt that week

The task will be explained at the top of the sheet and introduced to the children before it is sent home.

How you can help your child

- It is important that your child reads regularly, this can include their favourite books, recipes, road signs, instructions for games.
 - Visit Reading Eggs, Phonics Play (www.phonicsplay.co.uk) and Purple Mash
 - Count in steps of 1, 2, 5, and 10.
 - Recognise shapes and numbers (beyond 10) around the house and in the local area.
 - Practise writing their full name and other familiar words using correct letter formation
