On Friday, the whole school took part in "Show Racism The Red Card." Here are some of the great activities each year group did.

Reception children all dressed in red and shared a circle time all about accepting and celebrating others differences.

In Year 1 they looked at the story 'we are all different'. The children used this to inspire them to make their own book about their class's differences. The children thought about their different appearances, languages they speak and the different activities that they enjoy.



In Year 3, they created individual posters about diversity and racism. The children also had the opportunity to speak out about diversity and what they think in a speech.

Year 4 completed word searches about Diversity and Tolerance. They learnt about ways



in which we are all unique, what racism is and how it can make people feel. The children then designed their own football t-shirts on this theme.
