
Music

Hertfordshire County Council's Public Health team has produced a Children and Young People's Mental Health and Wellbeing report (CYPMH). The report analysis spans:

- prevalence rates
- factors influencing wellbeing
- hospital admissions related to mental health and self-harm
- access to mental health services.

Key Messages

- In 2023, approximately **1 in 5 children and young people** nationally had a probable mental disorder, equating to c.**47,542 in Hertfordshire**.
- Almost **1 in 10 school children** reported having a diagnosed mental health condition in 2023.
- In **female school children**, prevalence of a diagnosed mental health condition considerably increased with age, from **6.8% in Year 7 to 15.7% in Year 11**.
- Prevalence of a diagnosed mental health condition in school children varied across Hertfordshire. Watford had the lowest prevalence with 5.7%, with Broxbourne (13.0%) and Stevenage (12.7%) having the highest.
- In school children, 23.9% reported low happiness, 17.5% reported low life satisfaction,
 18.7% reported low worthwhile, and 6.1% reported never feeling hopeful.
- Hospital admission rates in 2023 where mental health was the primary cause were 65 per
 100,000 in Hertfordshire, significantly lower then England (78 per 100,000).
- Hospital admission rates in 2023 where self-harm was the primary cause were 123 per 100,000 in Hertfordshire, significantly lower then England (160 per 100,000).
- Female school children were significantly more likely to have accessed mental health services than males.
- Male school children were more likely to have found the mental health support helpful.
