You can't teach children to behave better by making them feel worse. When children feel better they behave better.

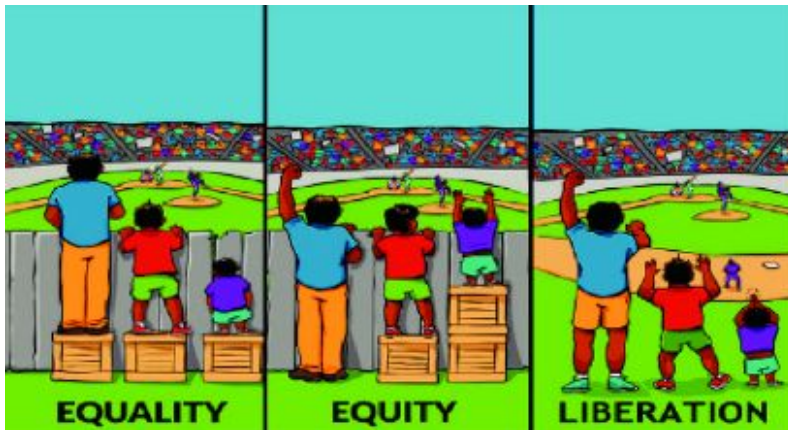

- Curriculum meetings for **parents** in the autumn term

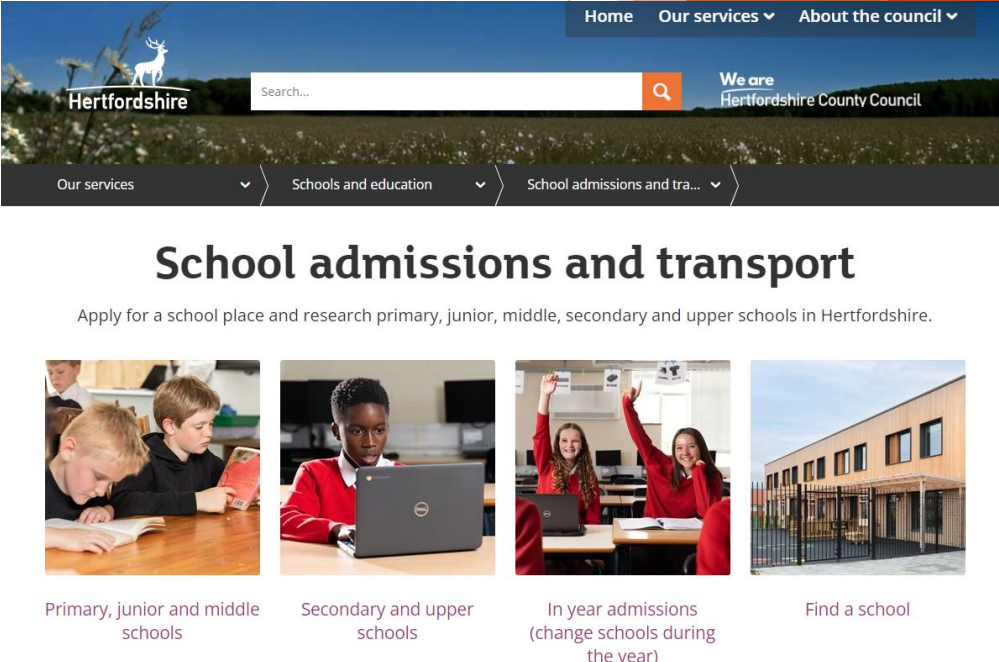
Key dates for admissions

- 2nd November 2026 - Online admissions opens (online applications preferred)
- January 2027 - Deadline to apply for a school place
- 16th April 2027 - Allocation day
- 23rd April 2027 - Last date to accept place
