This Sunday, 10th October, is **World Mental Health Day** and the World Federation for Mental Health are raising awareness about mental health, prevention, advocacy and best practice for proper treatment and care worldwide. They are particularly asking us to think about the issues that cause mental health inequality both locally and globally. Stigma, misconceptions and discrimination towards those with mental health issues is one key reason for these inequalities. Almost 9 out of 10 people

with mental health problems say that the stigma surrounding mental health has a negative impact on their education, work and personal lives. The stigma around mental health can make it more difficult for those having difficulties to seek help. The children have been learning more about mental health and normalizing the discussion about all of our mental health and wellbeing, in order to help break down these barriers for future generations.

BREAKFAST CLUB

- Breakfast Club runs from 7.30am to 8:45 am and includes breakfast.
- Breakfast club costs £3.50 per child per day.
- Children must be signed into the club by whoever is bringing them to school.
- Children should not be dropped at the gate and sent into the club on their own. Breakfast on offer includes such choices as: cereal, toast, croissants, fruit, and fruit juices.
