

CLASS OF THE WEEK - Wilson This week Wilson class have been learning how plants transport water and nutrients from the roots to the leaves. We completed an experiment with celery and food colouring but it did not work. We showed determination by trying again with ink instead. This worked! We found that the ink travelled through the little tubes in the stem of the celery up to the leaves. The leaves were blue on the tips and mottled. We cut the celery open so we could see what had happened inside, we found the tubes were blue. This showed that the water travels through tubes in the stem which act like tiny straws. We have left a stalk of celery in the ink to see if it changes further.
