
Donaldson class had a really fun Halloween day on Thursday.

They made paper plate pumpkins and decorated cupcake spiders. Everyone thought it was really good fun!




During Child initiated Learning this week Robyn created a card to say thank you to Mrs Harvie for helping her. She was supported to use her phonics to write.



No Pens Wednesday is celebrated every year across our school. To celebrate spoken language activities and put an emphasis on speaking, rather than writing, for that day. The aim of the day is to help children develop their oral language skills. These are fundamental for learning to read and write, managing emotions, maintaining friendships and for employment later in life. It's perceived that spoken language is underrepresented in the national curriculum in comparison to reading and writing, so this day brings the importance of spoken language into focus.

Our pupils took part in a range of activities such as making Anderson shelters in Year 6 and in Year 3 pupils used Salt dough to represent the bones and teeth of Animals in The Stone Age!



Music at The Leys is all happening once more, as the safety rules relating to Covid are relaxed! What an **absolute joy** it is to hear your children singing again and for everyone to be able to use all the instruments too! No wonder listening to music and making music is so beneficial to our positive Mental Health!

Our specialist music teacher, Mrs Gwinnett, is now back teaching music across the year groups Y1 to Y4 again. The pupils in Y5 are making the steel pans ring out in the Infant Hall every week and the Y4 children are learning to play the recorder as they missed the opportunity to do this last year when they were in Y3.

The choir, (for children in Y4, Y5 and Y6) is up and running again on Tuesday lunchtimes at 12.30pm. The children are super keen to sing together and they are already working hard to learn the songs and dances that they will be performing at the Young Voices concert at the SSE Arena in Wembley on 1st February 2022.


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## Lost Uniform

<u> Stay & Share KS1 & KS2 -8.50 to 9.10 am</u>


