STEAM

The theme for STEAM week was "How we can explore the world around us" with classes taking the opportunity to explore the outdoor school environment. In Year 6, children gathered things found in nature to create portraits, using different shades and textures to good effect.

Year 5 took pictures of our school environment, making comparisons about the area. They also completed sketches of an outside object and then adapted it to create something useful- for example they sketched a tree stump and then adapted it to create an outside table.



Year 4 have been studying cityscapes and designing their own model cities, giving careful thought to the materials they could use to build them. They then used their designs to begin building their cities from recyclable materials.

PE / Sport Update



On Thursday 9th June , 10 students from our Year 5/6 cohort participated in a Stevenage Athletics competition competing against 14 other schools. The children smashed their events and 80% of them made it to the finals. We came away with 2

individual gold medals, 2 individual silver medals and 1 individual bronze medal. Our mixed relay team also came away with a bronze medal from their event. Mr Newlands also won a gold medal in the teachers 4x100m relay, showing the children how to properly do it . We also got mentioned in the local comet newspaper!

St Ippolyts won the Year 4 group, with Shephalbury Park, Peartree Spring and Codicote all tied for second, while Roebuck, The Leys and Codicote were also separated by just two points in the combined Year 5 and 6 category.
