



# The highlight of the week in the Key worker pod 3 (in Wilson class

# The highlight of the week in the Key worker pod (in the Y2 building!)



On Monday we started to make wool monsters. We first watched a tutorial on how to make them so we understood what to do. We got all our equipment: 5 straws, 2 different coloured wool pieces, and tape. First we cut the straw at the tips and started to thread the wool though the 5 straws which was a struggle. We constantly kept getting it stuck! Once all the struggle was over, we taped the wool to the straws. As soon as we did that, we got a different colour of wool. We then tied a knot to keep it in place then we went in and out of the straws to make it look like we were weaving it. Soon we will have to braid the other colour that we used to thread the wool through the straws as hair and arms (which we are going to sew on) and the legs we will use the excess wool for too. Finally we will finish by putting on googly eyes of all shapes and sizes. Then our woolly friends will be made!!!

# The highlight of the week in Year 3 -Wilson

We have been playing some fun games on our Google class meet, this week we played the Yes/No game. It was really interesting to see what sort of questions caught us out. Oliver and Chloe even came onto the classroom after to say what fun they had. Meanwhile in school we have been making salt dough, look at Simra's amazing work, we will paint them later.





### The highlight of the week in Nursery

This week in Nursery we have been discussing what we need to do to stay healthy. We have talked about different forms of exercise and personal hygiene. We have discussed our favourite healthy foods and we also made healthy pizza faces.



### The highlight of the week in Year 6—Shakespeare

This week, Shakespeare pods have been delving further into pandemics. We learnt that one of the ways in which the spread of a disease is measured is by its reproduction number, known as 'R'. For example, Ebola virus has an R number of two, this means that every infected person is likely to infect two more, who will each infect two more and so on. This is sometimes called exponential growth. We carried on this doubling of numbers on a chess board grid. Assuming that each infected person takes a week to become infectious, we calculated that after seven weeks 128 people would have

the virus. What really blew our minds was when we looked at the spread of measles, which has an R number of 16. We calculated that after the same time span (seven weeks), 268 million people would have become infected. All we can say is thank goodness there is a vaccine for measles!!!



### The highlight of the week in Reception—Zephaniah

This week in Zephaniah class we have been looking at patterns, after talking about different patterns they can see on their clothes and in the classroom the children used fabric pens to create their own t shirt's. The children loved creating their own t shirt and really took their time with the designs.



### The highlight of the week in Year 1—Carle

Carle class have been making happy rainbow clouds from the website krokotak and identifying the most common wildflowers in our meadow. One pods thought it was daisies and the other thought it



was the buttercups.



### The highlight of the week in Year 1– Sendak

In Sendak class this week we have been learning to tell the time. We looked at o'clock and half past times. The children use the clocks to show different times and also enjoyed several games of time bingo.
