UPDATE

STEAM is an approach to teaching and learning that integrates science, technology, engineering, the arts, and math as pathways to guide student inquiry, discussions, and critical thinking.

This week we have been focusing on our oceans and how we can look after them. We have been finding out about the things that are affecting the ocean such as plastic and oil spills. Classes have been coming up with ideas on how to reduce the plastic that ends up in the ocean and find innovative ways to remove oil spills.

In Year 3 we have been up-cycling old cd's to make some coasters. The children are really excited to give these as gifts when they are completed. We are all pleased that we have saved the cd's from landfill.

Who do I talk to if I can't sleep? The National Sleep Helpline can help with your sleep problems.

If you'd like to talk about your sleep, you can call between 7pm and 9pm, Sunday to Thursday on 03303 530 541

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Do you struggle to fall asleep? Do you feel tired? Do you have a child who won't sleep or stay in their own bed?

Having a sleep issue is surprisingly common. At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

This helpline is run by a team of specialist trained sleep advisors. Although they cannot give medical advice, they can talk through your issues, offer you some practical strategies and recommend services that could help.

Sleep education is empowering – you can understand why you might not be sleeping well and how that can change. They promise to listen without judgement and help you decide what next steps are right for you.

To showcase the impact of professional partnerships on student learning outcomes of UK and Nepal.







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
The Levs Have Talent



BREAKFAST CLUB
